
Thanks to everyone we've spoken with over the past year, including those who took part in our annual residents' survey. As we continue with our community vision work and share more information from NWS over this next year, keep a look-out for events as we continue this journey.



#### Communications

We use a range of communications including GDF News, our printed newsletter to homes, press releases, social media, e-bulletins and website

updates. We're also working towards a refreshed website to provide clear, easy-to-navigate information.



Community engagement is a priority. We want to make sure we share information in an understandable way. so we hold regular drop-ins throughout the year, as well as attend events organised by other local groups. Over the past year, we've held or attended 66 events and spoken with 1,114 people.





#### **Community Vision**

We're creating a community vision to look at what's important locally and how a GDF can shape that vision. We've held a number of forums for people to discuss hopes and ideas for the area, plus an online questionnaire. One of the main topics of conversation to date has been transport.

#### Youth Work

We've continued our work with young people this year, which included working with two different scout groups as well as local young farmers. Their involvement has provided us with valuable insight and our work with youth groups will continue.





#### **Community Investment Funding**

Local organisations have successfully applied for and been awarded Community Investment Funding from the GDF programme; it's a pleasure to see such progress. We've awarded £1million this year - totalling £3million in the past three years.
